## PROCEEDINGS OF THE EXECUTIVE COM-MITTEE OF THE TENNESSEE ACADEMY OF SCIENCE

Meeting of January 19, 1935, at Nashville. The properly audited Treasurer's Report was approved, a brief report was made by the Secretary on the condition of the Academy Membership, and a Membership Committee of 18 members was appointed to solicit new members. The chairman of this committee is Dr. Charles S. Shoup of the Department of Biology of Vanderbilt University. One member, Professor David O. McNeely of Paris, has already sent in 12 new members.

Diehl, President of Southwestern, was elected a Life Sustaining Member, and Mr. Damon Headden, Tennessee State Game Warden, was elected a member of the Board of Trustees of the Reelfoot Lake Biological Station for the three-year-term, 1935-1937. Other minor business was transacted. It was decided to hold the spring meeting of the Academy at the Biological Station at Reelfoot Lake, April 26-27.
