WENDELL G. HOLLADAY, NEW SECRETARY OF THE TENNESSEE ACADEMY OF SCIENCE

Dr. Wendell G. Holladay was born August 23, 1925, in Huntingdon, Tennessee. After receiving the B.A. and M.A. degrees from Vanderbilt University, he attended the University of Wisconsin where he was awarded the Ph.D. in 1954. Dr. Holladay was a Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation Fellow from 1950 to 1952 and a National Science Foundation Predoctoral Fellow from 1952 to 1954. He became Assistant Professor of Physics Vanderbilt in 1954 and Associate Professor in 1957. He spent the summer of 1956 as a visiting research physicist at the Radiation Laboratory in Berkeley. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1943 to 1946 and is now an Ensign in the U. S. Navy Reserve.

In addition to his affiliation with the Tennessee Academy of Science Dr. Holladay is a member of the American Physical Society, Sigma Xi and Phi Beta Kappa.

Dr. Holladay is married to Virginia Mershon of Nashville. They are the parents of three children, Frank Warren, Mark
