NOTICE TO AUTHORS

Papers submitted for publication in the Journal may be sent to any member of the editorial staff. Manuscripts must be approved by the Editor and the appropriate Section Editor before publication. Manuscripts should be typewritten, double or triple spaced, with wide margins, and with legends for figures typed on a separate page. Recent issues should be consulted with regard to matters of style. Each table should be placed on a separate sheet. Footnotes should not be used except very rarely. Greek letters and symbols should be avoided as much as possible.

The style for the list of references should conform to the style used in recent issues of the JOURNAL. This list should be headed Literature Cited. The following example illustrates the proper style to be used for references:
