NOTICE TO AUTHORS

Manuscripts submitted for publication in the JOURNAL should be sent to the Editor. Manuscripts must be approved by the Editor and the appropriate Section Editor before publication. Manuscripts should be submitted in duplicate, typewritten, double spaced with wide margins, and with legends for figures typed on a separate page. Recent issues should be consulted with regard to matters of style. Each table should be placed on a separate sheet. Footnotes should not be used except very rarely. Greek letters and symbols should be avoided as much as possible.

Each paper should be supplied with an abstract not to exceed 250 words.

Photographs (black and white glossy prints) may be accepted as illustrations; however, line drawings and diagrams are preferable. Drawings should be made in India ink on white paper or Bristol Board. An article containing more than 2 illustrations can be published only with financial cooperation of the author.

A per page charge of \$10.00 will be made to industrial contributors.
