
PRESIDENT OF THE TENNESSEE ACADEMY OF SCIENCE FOR 1994

Dr. Wilburn Andy Sliger has been Professor of Biology at the University of Tennessee at Martin since 1984 and Chairman of the Department of Biological Sciences since 1985. He received his Bachelor of Science degree from Central Oklahoma State University. His Master of Science and Doctor of Philosophy degrees are from Oklahoma State University. Dr. Sliger was first employed at the University of Tennessee, Martin Branch, in 1966 as an instructor. He has been continuously employed with the University of Tennessee system since that date.

In addition to his teaching experience at the University of Tennessee at Martin, his professional activities include teaching adjunctly at Murray State University, serving as President of the University Faculty Senate, chairing search committees, and serving on numerous University committees and task forces. He is a member of Sigma Xi and has served as President and secretary of the UT-Martin Club.

Dr. Sliger and his students have presented papers at annual meetings of the Tennessee Academy of Science. He has served as Zoology Section Chairman and has been a member of the Executive Committee of the Academy since 1991. He has been active in research, dealing primarily with ecological problems of Reelfoot Lake. He has served as consultant for private corporations in Tennessee and Missouri in solving problems with water quality.

In addition to membership in the Tennessee Academy of Science, Dr. Sliger has been associated with several professional organizations including Sigma Xi, Tennessee Chapter of the Fisheries Society, Tennessee Science Department Chairs Organization, International Aquatic Plant Management Society-Southeastern Division, Association for Biology Laboratory Education, American Fisheries Society, and the Tennessee Wildlife Society.
