Sarah (Sally) Swain, Associate Professor of Biology at Middle Tennessee State University (MTSU), was honored by the Tennessee Academy of Science (TAS) with the prestigious Distinguished Service Award at the 2002 annual meeting held at East Tennessee State University. This award is given in recognition of a TAS Member who has made significant contributions to the Academy by serving in an official capacity. The award was presented by former President, Dr. Martin Stewart, who cited Swain's critical role in the Academy as Secretary for the past 11 years, and her tireless efforts working with the Local Arrangements Committee planning the historic 2001 joint meeting between the TAS and the Kentucky Academy of Science. Ms. Swain has been a member of the MTSU Biology faculty since 1969, and is currently course coordinator for General Biology 1110. She serves on the MTSU Honors Council and acts as a consultant for the College Board Placement Exams, and various textbook publishing companies. She has been published in the British Medical Journal Lancet, and The Journal of the Tennessee Academy of Science. Ms. Swain was recently recog-
